Rylstone School Helps Us Celebrate
Rylstone Public School children helped to celebrate the 50th anniversary of RDHS by having a day devoted to local and Australian history. Some of the children and most of the teachers were dressed in old-fashioned clothing. RDHS President, Helen Marsonet, greeted students in the school hall, and talked about "What is History?" before telling them a story from her days at Rylstone Public - having her front tooth yanked out on a string by a school mate and then having the tooth eaten by a chicken! Students then broke into groups and played games such as marbles and skipping. They also plaited rags for rug-making, made damper, tried calligraphy, learned barn dances and other old time activities. Some of the children visited the Cottage Museum where they tried mashing potatoes, beating eggs, hand cranking a sewing machine and squeezing lemons – the theme being 'No Electricity'.

Matters from the August General Meeting

BVI Management

Future management options

were circulated via RDHS Newsletter. The following options, along with any others raised on the night, were discussed...

- keep it as it is but pay an agent for a higher level of service;
- keep it as it is and pay a housekeeper to handle daily business;
- lease it out to someone else to run it as a B&B;
- lease out the space and no longer run a B&B.

The meeting agreed to keep the BVI apartment under the control of the RDHS and operated it as Bed & Breakfast accommodation. It was resolved by the meeting that further investigation of how best to do this,

using either an agent or housekeeper, should be undertaken by the Committee and that the membership should be kept up to date on any developments by Newsletter.

Future of the Cottage Museum

The meeting supported the following motion... "That a sub-committee is established to review the scope and purpose of the Cottage Museum, survey the community and make a recommendation for the future role and management of the Cottage within the BVI precinct to the Membership with the year"
