- + Updating and printing of BVI apartment flyers Three quotes have been sought, Printstorm quote accepted. 1000 flyers for BVI apartment will be printed for \$182.50.
- * Tenants small rent increases took effect on 1st March. These increases are necessary to keep pace with increases in electricity and water costs.
- * Wasps have become a problem around the BVI. Stone's Pest Control will not be in the area until June and a special call out would cost several hundred dollars. While the problem is controllable, we will continue to use a knock-down spray when needed.
- * Advertising The BVI apartment is currently advertised on the tourism sign at Ilford. We will continue this with a payment of \$100 to Rylstone Kandos Business & Tourism.
- + Quilt Exhibition planning discussion
- * Committee member, Ed, reported on the security workshop held in Kandos by the Central Tablelands Chapter of Museums Australia. A document 'Museum Security safeguarding your collection' was tabled.
- * Bylong Catholic Church discussion regarding a request for information about the burials in the churchyard. Society will reply and ask for copies of any information for the archives.
- * Museum Guides a shortage of volunteers is causing concern.
- * Letter to members requesting volunteers has resulted in only one reply. No other offers of assistance to date.
