Thank you also to the small group of volunteers that assisted on the day with painting and other tasks. The new management committee are all working well and have settled into their responsibilities associated with managing the RDHS. RDHS member attendance was poor at the recent working bee held on Saturday 17th October 2015. Unfortunately, many tasks that were on the maintenance list will have to wait for another day. With much appreciation I want to thank Alan Willis, Owain James & Anne Ward for their assistance with the sanding and re-painting of the railing on the northern end of BVI front verandah. Ed Windle and myself spent a combined 50+ man hours over the weekend, repairing and re- painting the timber fascia, installing flashing and re-fixing the guttering on the BVI using a knuckle & boom hired for the purpose of undertaking this necessary maintenance.

'A Celebration of the Bylong Valley Way' – report from Debra Bush.

The successful event was held over the weekend of the 24/25 October at Bylong. I took the opportunity to spend several hours last Saturday talking, listening and reading a wealth of information that had been prepared and presented by our F&LHG co-ordinator Fiona Nevell in conjunction with event co-ordinator, local resident and Secretary of the BVPA, Craig Shaw. RDHS & F&LHG member Jeannette McCarthy was also present at the Bylong Hall and was coordinating the recording of documents and photographs contributed on the day.
